

SUMMARY



TÖRÖK Enikő: County Maps Used by the Land-tax Defining Committees

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Country maps were demanded and used by the Viennese Cadastral Directorate, the regional and provincial cadastral tax committees for all of their work. They were needed by the officials and engineers without local geographical knowledge to define the tax defining settings and their work reports about the survey.

TÖRÖK Enikő: Maps of the Tax Regions (1855–1856, 1858)

The task of the engineers in chief was to prepare a 1:144,000 rate regional map after finishing the surveys for the definition of the temporary land tax. Sometimes this work was completed by survey assistants or engineers with the direction of the engineer in chief, e.g. in the Sopron and Pozsony/Bratislava tax regions. The Nagyváradi and Kassa maps were prepared by Johann Mischkowsky and Josef Lokarner engineers in chief according to the title label.



SCHMIDT Anikó: The Cadastral Workshop

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The two modifications of the land-tax 1875:VII. were worked out by the cadastral workshop working during the 1879–1881 parliament session. The propositions made by the workshop were accepted at the beginning of the session and were also signed by the Monarch (1881:XL., 1881:XLII.).



BALATON Petra: The Cadastral Directorate in Kolozsvár

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The Cadastral Directorate in Kolozsvár (Cluj) completed the land-tax regulations, as well as the preparation of the new taxing activities regarding the ongoing land redefinitions in the area of Transylvania from 1875. Ten years later the directorate completed the land-tax regulation work as part of the national land cadastral organisation, to convey the facilitation of the land consolidation processes. The Engineering Department of the Directorate conveyed the monitoring of the land consolidations from 1894, and it was reformulated as a Survey Office with its own authority in 1908.



REISZ T. Csaba: The Appeal of the Cadastral Survey Officials to Have their Salaries Increased (1892)

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One of the first decisions taken by the 1892–1896 parliament period was to regulate the salaries of the governmental (sub)officials and servants (1893:IV.). 280 appeals were posted by different groups of employees regarding the law proposition. The survey officials claimed their protest that some posts were classified as lower rank, and their salaries hardly increased. Their appeals were not considered.



ZÁVOCZKI Adrienn: A Surveyor Managing the Cadastral Journal: Career of Dobrovics, Győző between 1880 and 1931

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Dobrovics Győző (Viktor) was employed as surveyor engineer of the cadastral survey organisation in 1880. Between 1894 and 1902 he was the manager of the Cadastral Journal. The Monarch entrusted him twice to organise and assess the Hungarian–Romanian border, and as a result he was awarded with the Knight Cross of the Imperial Austrian Franz Joseph Order, the title of the engineering counsellor, as well as Hungarian nobility with the praedicatum of ostffyasszonyfai.



TAKÁCS Krisztián–BRAUNMÜLLER Péter: Changes in the fentrol.hu digital aerial photograph archive

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The fentrol.hu online aerial photograph archive has been broadened by approximately 10.000 images per half year since the Digital Aerial Photograph Archive project was successfully completed on 30th June 2014. At the moment nearly 104.000 images can be browsed and downloaded for free of charge including coloured and infrared images as well. As a military decision allows the decryption of the encrypted areas of the images, most of them are uploaded with full content, however, there are still some with encrypted areas that were mainly made in the '50s and '60s, when the emulsion was removed from the negatives.
